On behalf of the *Biolinguistics* Editorial Board, we thank all our readers, authors, and reviewers for supporting us in 2019 and wish you all a successful 2020! This year has been one of change and growth for open access publishing in general, and for our journal in particular. Behind the scenes, there has been much activity at *Biolinguistics*, including a complete overhaul of our website, which is more user-friendly and has streamlined the review process for our editorial staff, reviewers, and authors alike. In 2019, we have continued to value the quality of papers we publish over quantity: Throughout the year, we received over a dozen submitted manuscripts. This next year is already shaping up to be a busy one: 8 original submissions are currently in the process of external peer review or are being revised by the authors as the result of the stringent peer review process.

We are also very much looking forward to the Special Issue 'Biolinguistic Research in the 21st Century', guest-edited by Lluís Barceló-Coblijn. The Special Issue is open to submissions until 30 April 2020, with a targeted publication date around September 2020. It invites novel contributions related to the ontogeny of the human cognitive capacity, similarities and differences in the developmental tracks of between multilingual and monolingual speakers, evolutionary paths followed by our species, and other related questions. In addition to the website transition and the instantiation of our new core editorial team, we also implemented the introduction of Registered Reports, which will undergo a two-stage review on the basis of a detailed study protocol prior to the actual research to be carried out (see <https://www.biolinguistics.eu/index.php/biolinguistics/registered-reports>).
